FORMER EXECUTIVE EDITOR OF PITTSBURGH POST-GAZETTE

Employing a case-study method, this workshop will examine matters regarding journalism ethics, exploring both abstract questions and applications on the ground. Considering a variety of cases, ranging from presidential politics to war reporting, the sessions will draw from Mr. Shribman's hands-on experience as reporter and editor, as well as his insight about the profession more generally.

David Shribman has recently retired from the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, having led the paper since 2003. Prior to that, he served as the Washington bureau chief for The Boston Globe, where he won a 1995 Pulitzer Prize. Earlier in his career, he wrote for other newspapers, including The Wall Street Journal and The New York Times. He is presently a scholar in residence at Carnegie Mellon University and will begin an appointment next fall at McGill University in Montreal.
